



Made in USA, BABA, and BAA Compliance Memo

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Dear Valued Mermet Customer,

Demand for USA-made fabrics has never been stronger. Based on requests from our customers, architects, dealers, and designers, we are pleased to provide an update on Mermet fabrics and their compliance with Made in USA, the Build America, Buy America Act (BABA), and the Buy American Act (BAA).

- Made in USA: According to the Federal Trade Commission, this means that all or virtually all of the product is made in America, with significant parts, processing, and labor of U.S. origin. We are proud to confirm these fabrics are manufactured in the United States of America.
- Build America, Buy America Act (BABA): Established under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (2022), BABA requires that products for federally funded projects be manufactured in the United States with most components sourced domestically. The current threshold is at least 55% U.S. content.
- **Buy American Act (BAA):** Enacted in 1933, the BAA applies to direct federal government procurement. To comply, a product must be manufactured in the U.S. and meet a domestic content standard of 65%.

We are pleased to confirm that the following Mermet fabrics are **compliant with Made in USA, BABA, and BAA requirements** and can be confidently specified for projects requiring these standards:
